





I am always leery about planning a brand-new Motor-Stadt event, especially when it involves coordinating with a heretofore unknown club. Well, this time it worked out. The inaugural Porsche-Corvette Challenge autocross on July 10 was a great success. I was worried that enough Porsches would show up, but not to fear—we had seven cars running on the Motor-Stadt team. The Capital City Corvette Club team had nine entries. Thus, we had a legitimate contest. The Corvettes were mostly recent models including a new mid-engine C8. The Porsche team included three 911s driven by Conan Dombroski, Steve Lee, and Gene (surname?) from Western Michigan Region, two Caymans driven by Rob Allie and Bob Bunchek, a Boxster S driven by Matt MacFadden, and a 944 driven by Paul Fedele. Ken Jones was the starter and I was the timekeeper. After three practice runs in the morning the competition began after lunch. Each car had six runs on the course, broken into two heats. In the end Porsche prevailed, with a team average of 42.9 seconds versus 45.8 seconds for Corvette. An award ceremony at the conclusion awarded the traveling trophy to the Porsche team. Everyone was enthusiastic about a repeat, so the trophy will again be in contention when we schedule again next year. We were favored by partly cloudy weather and temperatures in the high 70s. A great turnout of volunteers and spectators added to the success of the event. Several people brought their cars just to show them off. I think all our club members in attendance enjoyed interacting with the Corvette folks. That in itself made the event worthwhile. 

PCA Motor-Stadt Region Board Minutes Jul 13th, 2021

Proposed agenda for the Jul 13th 2021 meeting was approved (Moved J. Yen / Seconded S. Lee)

Meeting Minutes of Jun 8th, 2021 were previously approved online.

Membership – Ken reported that the current membership is 144 primary, 74 affiliate members with 8 Junior members.

Treasurer's Report – Mark provided the report online prior to the meeting. The board reviewed the key data and we have \$4,257.26 in checking and \$10,624.77 in the investment account for a total of \$14,882.03. It was noted the \$32.39 expense noted as "web design" should be recoded as "flags for track events". The report was approved unanimously (Moved S. Lee / Seconded D. Dickmann)

Advertising and Insurance – No new advertising items to report. Insurance waivers have been provided for all moving events and the Porsche on the Mac waiver is already in hand.

Publications – Don has prepared the next newsletter for July publication pending minutes from this meeting and the Presidents letter. James has been posting our events on Face Book and monitoring the e-mail and website. The Mac event will move to the lead item on the Webpage.

Committee Reports / Activities: The club really needs an event chair. Contact Motorstadt.pca@gmail.com to help.

Old Business:

- Porsche on the Mac II is on August 6th, 7th and 8th. Over 45 cars have registered at the St. Ignace site. There is still plenty of time to register and join the fun. Don is working with a local hotel hoping to coordinate a reception for Friday after registration. A motion was made to purchase 1st/2nd/3rd prizes for the event of \$150/\$100/\$50. (Moved J. Yen / Seconded S. Lee) and approved unanimously.
- Spring Kickoff Delayed and rainy but still a huge success! \$956 was raised for charity and the dealership sold 3 cars. A motion was made to add \$244 to the \$956 raised to send to the Lansing food bank (Moved D. Dickmann / Seconded T. Whitney) and approved unanimously.
- Corvette vs. Porsche Autocross The event was a success with both parties wanting to run again in the future. \$590 was received in entry fees to more than cover our \$525 in expenses. Thanks to all that came out to help.

New Business:

- A motion was made to purchase an electronic megaphone for outdoor events not to exceed \$175 (Moved S. Lee / Seconded D. Dickmann) and approved unanimously.
- Exploring new events with the dealership Discussion was had regarding involving the dealership in more events.
 Possibly starting driving events from the dealership (like a postponed winter dinner), drivers education meetings at the dealer and other events.
- Terrill will investigate track availability for a potential Aug event
- Meeting adjourned at 7:50 (Moved S. Lee / Seconded J. Yen)





From the Editor

A dilemma faces anyone buying a new car: trade in your existing car to the dealer or try selling it yourself. I am sure you all have faced this decision. After a deal is made trading it in is simplest; hand the keys from the old car over and drive away with the new. But that convenience will cost you some money. Selling a car on your own can be a tricky and fraught with peril—the hassle of advertising the car and dealing with prospective buyers, some of whom may not be trustworthy. And the deal may take time or fall through. But if you are careful, you will gain more for that old car than if you traded it in and the new car will cost you that much less. Everyone has her/his own comfort level with these two options; neither on its own is right or wrong.

Except for my very first new car purchase back in 1965, when I traded in a rather beat up 1953 Chevy four-door for a red Mustang Fastback, I have elected to sell the old car on my own. So far, I have done pretty well on these transactions. In May of this year I ordered a new 718 Cayman GTS from Porsche of Okemos. Hopefully, it will be delivered around Thanksgiving. Why a brand-new car when so many gorgeous preowned cars are out there for sale? I confess that I wanted a car optioned just exactly according to my specifications with no compromises, because this 718 probably is the last car I will buy. I will have to live with the instant depreciation that occurs when I drive the car off the dealer lot. In the meantime, one of my existing Porsches had to go; I don't want to own three of them. So, the racing green 997 911 Carrera S was put on the block. I loved that car and hated to lose it, but that's the harsh reality.

I placed an ad on the PCA Mart website on a Sunday afternoon late in June. In a matter of minutes I began to receive email inquiries. Then early the following morning I sold the car by phone to an independent dealer in Long Island, NY. After a short bit of haggling, he agreed to the full price I was asking, about 7 percent more than I paid for the car originally and 11 percent over what the dealer offered on a trade in. The buyer immediately wired \$1,000 to my PayPal account as earnest money. He didn't even want a pre-purchase inspection, just looked the car over on Apple FaceTime. After the balance of the purchase price was wired to my bank account, I Fedexed the title, service records, and extra key to the dealer. An AutoBox transporter rig picked the car up a few days ago, and off it went to New York. I was a bit shaken by how little time and effort it took to sell that car. It hasn't always been that easy!

The market for pre-owned Porsches apparently is hot right now. If you are considering selling your car, don't delay. We are in a post-lockdown buying bubble and it probably won't last. Might as well take advantage while you can. And don't neglect to advertise your car on PCA's Mart!
