

When is the Last Time You Attended a Driving Event?

My fiancé Ashley and I attended the Rennsport Dragon Rally this past October, our third time at this event. The three-day event is focused on driving the mountain roads in North Carolina, Tennessee, South Carolina, and Georgia. We enjoy driving hundreds of miles in our fantastic Porsche Cayman GT4, but that is only part of the reason we continue to attend these events.



Let's talk about the Dragon Rally. It is probably the largest Porsche event in the U.S. In past, there have been over 220 Porsches in attendance, although this past fall hat number dropped to around 140. All sorts of Porsche models and years. From air cooled to a GT3 RS to a Macan Turbo, all shapes, sizes and colors were represented. The event was separated in three different groups: spirited, touring, and cruising. You can choose your group prior to the event but can switch if you feel the need to change during the three days.

The roads are spectacular! Beautiful views of the Smokey Mountains with picturesque streams and small towns. A large portion of the drives are on winding country roads that are a blast to drive in your Porsche. It feels like the roads were made for these cars. Of course, we visited the Tail of the Dragon, an eleven-mile stretch on Highway 129 on the border of Tennessee and North Carolina. There are 318 curves and switchbacks in that eleven miles. Traffic usually is heavier in that area because of the popularity with sport bikes, slingshots, and every other vehicle you can imagine, even an occasional RV that took a wrong turn. But there are more than enough turn-offs during those eleven miles. Sometimes a sport bike may want to go faster than a Porsche on the Dragon, but normally even other sports cars are pulling off for us.





After each break or gas stop, most of your group is smiling and catching up about that great stretch of road we just drove. After each day of driving, we all meet back at the Fontana Dam and Resort for a social time where you meet amazing people with great stories and backgrounds. Lasting memories are made that you can cherish for years.



Which brings me to ask when was the last time is you attended a driving event? Over the three events Ashley and I have attended, we have met and made lifelong friends from all over the country. Whether you are a hardcore racing enthusiast or just someone who enjoys a Sunday drive, there is an event for you somewhere. I challenge anyone who has not attended a driving event to do so. Certainly, we have had a challenging two years with COVID-19. Nonetheless, I encourage you to check your local PCA events. If your local club doesn't offer an event that fits with your schedule, look outside your local PCA Region or search the internet. The people you meet are always the highlight of the event and of course, the drive! As Ferdinand Porsche once said, "Our cars are meant to be driven, not polished."



Proposed agenda for the Dec 14th 2021 meeting was approved unanimously (Moved M. Haas / Seconded S. Lee)

Meeting Minutes - The Oct 12th, 2021 board meeting minutes were approved via E-mail.

From the Editor

Have you noticed that all new cars tend to look the same, especially from the rear? The only way to tell them apart is by looking for the company logo. Makes you wonder if there is a central design bureau somewhere that approves all these looks. The design homogeneity extends among American, German, Japanese, and Korean models, among others. Whereas radical changes are going on in the electronics and drive trains of cars, body styles are being churned out in homogeneous regularity. Part of this trend is due to the decline of sedans, wagons, and hatchbacks in favor of S.U.V.s, crossovers, and pickup trucks...must be but one way to design these vehicles! The only difference is that some are A LOT bigger than others. Farhad Monjoo of the *New York Times* recently commented: "Cars are growing brains...I just wish they weren't also losing heart, soul and personality." I tend to agree.

A notable exception to the above trend are Porsche sports cars—the Boxster, Cayman, and 911. Park a 1964 911 next to a new Porsche sports car and the DNA comes through loud and clear. Butzi Porsche's original design elements still are there: the roofline with the steeply inclined windshield, the gentle slope to the rear, the unique relationship between the lower hood and the pronounced front fenders, the sculpture of the rear fenders, the pronounced shoulders, the engine towards the rear. All these elements make a Porsche sports car of a post-1964 vintage instantly recognizable to anyone who knows anything about cars. Could you say that for any other marque, say when comparing a C1 with a C7 or C8 Corvette? I don't think so. Let's hope that Porsche AG sticks to the design success they have had.
