

The nineteenth annual Keeneland Concours d'Elegance will be held on July 16, 2022 in the heart of horse country, Lexington, Kentucky. The venue is the historic Keeneland Race Track. The Feature Marque will be Porsche. Four of the 20 judged classes will be Porsche. In addition, the PCA Bluegrass Region (BGS) will be holding a Porsche Hospitality Park inside the dedicated Car Club Paddock area. On the day prior to the concours, the BGS will also be hosting PCA Friday at Keeneland. PCA events this day will include a morning Concours Appreciation Training Session and an afternoon drive through horse country. Other activities available for visitors to enjoy include self-guided Walking Tours of the venue, visit to Gift Shop, observing Morning Thoroughbred Workouts, Meals at the Track Kitchen, Back Scenes of Concours site prep and the Keeneland Library. One of the Best Pecisions of My Life

This is the story of how I came to be the proud owner of a beautiful white 2018 Porsche Macan (base model, 4 cylinder, 252 hp.) with its eye-popping red and black leather interior.

The story begins when we met Jane in the MSU library in 1971. That year my then girlfriend, Linda, (now my wife of nearly 50 years), and I were undergraduates at Michigan State University, and we both had work-study jobs that involved the library. Linda worked for the library itself in circulation. I worked for my advisor, a professor in MSU's residential Justin Morrill College, on two different bibliographies relevant to my major: English Literature. I did the work for these in the MSU library, both in a carrel on the library's 4th floor and in the stacks.

In those ancient days, you found books by using the card catalogue. There were no computers.

What the library offered instead of technology was a reference desk, a section of the first floor right in the center of things. The experts who worked the reference desk were people with advanced degrees in library science. They knew the library inside out. They were our guides and computers.

Jane worked at the reference desk, so it was there that we met her. She was older than we were, library-savvy, helpful, attractive, sophisticated, and witty. Linda and I and our good friend Doug (eventually my best man in our wedding) hung around Jane and the reference desk much more than we really needed to (all of us charmed),

and eventually we all became very good friends.

Jane lived at the time in the faculty apartments on campus known as Cherry Lane and owned a car, a luxury none of us had at that point. It was a black Volkswagen Beetle, certainly a car for its time. It was reliable, inexpensive to operate, and, let's face it, cute. There were no garages available to Cherry Lane's residents, so it sat outside year around.

Near it in that Cherry Lane parking lot, there was also a mystery car. Something low and sleek and completely encased in a snug, dark protective cover.

I forget exactly how we found out the secret of the mystery car, but we did. It was a Porsche 911-S. And it belonged to Jane.

This knowledge added layers of depth to our appreciation of Jane. Owning a Porsche belied undercurrents of daring, adventure, and power.

And fortunately, all four of us fit in her Porsche (very snugly), so Jane could take us places. Quickly!

It will come as no surprise to anyone that when Linda and I married in 1973, Jane was Linda's maid of honor, and that we have been friends with her ever since.

Perhaps even at that early date, the Porsche seed had been planted in me, but it was dormant for many years.

Linda's and my automotive history began modestly enough. In 1976, we bought our first car: a Ford Granada. We were thrilled finally to have our own transportation!



Years later we graduated to an Olds Cutlass Ciera. A very good-looking car (burgundy inside and out) that was loaded with extras. It seemed the very height of luxury.

In 1989, our automotive life took a dramatic turn—to Jeep Wranglers. In the fall of that year we made our first trip to Arizona, staying in Scottsdale. We fell in love with the state immediately. While at our resort in Scottsdale we booked an early morning "Wild West Jeep Tour." The morning of the tour, we came down to the lobby to find a towering cowboy in a duster, cowboy hat, boots that came almost to his knees, and a gun belt with a six shooter. He introduced himself as "Crash," loaded us into his Jeep Wrangler, and off we sailed into a stunning desert morning.

Crash, who had worked for years on horse ranches in the area, taught us about the beauty and the dangers of the desert. We learned about the history of the area and about its Native inhabitants. We saw petroglyphs. We drank beer and even fired the 6-shooter at the empty cans. Everything about that morning was thrilling.

Not too long after we got home from our trip, I bought my first Jeep Wrangler and was in love with it. I had never loved driving so much. I drove Wranglers for the next 25-plus years. And when the Cutlass Ciera gave up the ghost, we bought a Jeep Grand Cherokee for Linda.

When my second Jeep Wrangler was put to rest (after nearly 14 years), I made one of the biggest mistakes of my life. The first two Wranglers I had purchased new from a Jeep dealership. The third one I bought used from a Chevrolet dealership without doing the due diligence.

It was heartache from the start. It was a four door Wrangler with tires worthy of a Monster Truck Rally. It was also literally full of sand from its extensive use off-road. The turn signals and brake lights worked "intermittently." The need for service and parts, however, was pretty much constant.

When I had finally had enough, I began to daydream about its replacement. Something smaller, reliable, and beautiful.

I should add that Linda and I had at this point been friends for decades with the editor of this newsletter and pillar of the Porsche community, Don Dickmann, and his wife Kathleen. Because of our earlier enchantment with Jane's 911-S, Don's beautiful Porsches triggered many happy memories.

At first I was thinking I might buy a Cadillac: a locally made car that was prestigious and beautiful.

But Don suggested that I at least take a look at Porsches. He thought the Cayenne or Macan might be what I was looking for. So, I started to investigate online.

Several days later, waiting at the traffic light at the intersection of Grand River Ave. and Hagadorn Road in East Lansing, I glanced over at the car in the lane next to me. What is that beautiful little car? I wondered. And then I realized: THAT is a Porsche Macan! And that, as they say, was that.

I told Don I was ready to act. He called the manager at the Porsche dealership and set up an appointment. I narrowed my search on the dealership's website. On Friday of that week, Don and I drove to Okemos Auto Collection, met the manager, who introduced me to the Porsche sales associate, Linda Daub. The Macan I was considering was ready to go.



Don, Linda Daub, and I did the test drive and came back to seal the deal.

Dealing with the Porsche dealership and its staff that day and every visit since has been perfect in every way.

When the transaction was completed, Don and I joined our wives for a celebratory lunch. The following Monday I picked up my Porsche Macan.

Even now, three years later, every time I go into the garage and see it, every time I get in and drive (zero to sixty in under 6 seconds), I say, "Wow!"









Thank you for joining us on the ride.



From the Editor

It came as a shock when I read the January 24 email from Tom Hernly, owner of Corrigan Oil Speedway, informing me that he has raised the daily track rental fee from \$450 to \$1,500. Although \$450 was really a ridiculously low fee, I did not expect that it would be more than tripled! That announcement produced shock waves throughout our board. We quickly concluded that a tripling of the normal \$30 fee for drivers running in the autocross would not work. Traditionally driver's fees have covered the cost of the track, often with a bit left over to add to our treasury. We would like to maintain that outcome. Not that \$90 would necessarily be out of reach for our members, but most of the participants at our events have been students from the MSU Racing Club. We thought \$90 might be too steep and discouraging for many of them.

Autocross events have been year in and year out among the most popular driver events sponsored by Motor-Stadt. Sadly, that has not been due to participation by club members. Although about 30 cars typically run the autocross course on a given day, only a half dozen or so are Porsches. Without the participation of enthusiastic and eager MSU Racing Club members and other like-minded car owners, our events would be a flop. Although all Porsches are made to race, that fact apparently is a hard sell for most members of Motor-Stadt. Given that autocross is a relatively safe way to explore the high-performance capabilities of your car, few members are willing to try it. When I see the number of well attended autocrosses, club races, track days, and driver's education events held by other regions, I just shake my head and wonder why the reluctance by our membership?

We are currently exploring alternate track venues. We are not excited by running an autocross around cones in a parking lot. A racetrack with infield cross-overs is an ideal location to set up an autocross course, although there still will be cones. We currently are looking at the Birch Run Speedway about an hour north of Lansing. It is an easy-off Interstate 75 and looks like a real possibility. Apparently, their daily track rental fee is \$1,000, which is more reasonable and affordable than Corrigan. We are too early in the game to have reached a firm decision, but we hope to have a new venue identified soon. We definitely will let you know.
