






Horsepower in Horse Country

The nineteenth annual Keeneland Concours d'Elegance will be held on July 16, 2022 in the heart of horse country, Lexington, Kentucky. The venue is the historic Keeneland Race Track. The Feature Margue will be **Porsche**. Four of the 20 judged classes will be Porsche. In addition, the PCA Bluegrass Region (BGS) will be holding a Porsche Hospitality Park inside the dedicated Car Club Paddock area. On the day prior to the concours, the BGS will also be hosting PCA Friday at Keeneland. PCA events this day will include a morning Concours Appreciation Training Session and an afternoon drive through horse country. Other activities available for visitors to enjoy include self-guided Walking Tours of the venue, visit to Gift Shop, observing Morning Thoroughbred Workouts, Meals at the Track Kitchen, Back Scenes of Concours site prep and the Keeneland Library. Also, nearby attractions include the KY Horse Park, the KY Aviation Museum, Distilleries, the KY Castle and Horse Farms. You may want to spend the entire weekend!



Proposed agenda – The agenda for the 8Mar2022 meeting was approved unanimously (Moved M. Haas / Seconded S. Lee)

Meeting Minutes - The Feb 8th, 2022 board meeting minutes were approved via E-mail.

From the Editor

I started reading car magazines in high school, whatever I could get my hands on. *Road and Track* was my favorite, but I also read *Hot Rod*. I was mostly interested in sports cars, not that I had any hope of purchasing or even driving any of them. But I could fantasize and endlessly yak about cars with friends. When it came to hot rods, I thought that most of them—style wise—fell short of the original car, the hot rodder's modifications gone amok. Sure, they might have a powerful new engine, a snazzy paint job, and be lowered almost to the pavement, but they mostly looked garish, ugly, and impractical. Plus, the original car was gone—how many unmolested 1932 Ford Roadsters or 1949 Mercurys are left?

I feel the same way about Porsche hot rods and "outlaws." A case in point is the featured "Rolling Sculpture" article in the February issue of *Panorama*. This issue features a car that exemplifies the extreme of Porsche hot rodding. In my opinion the owner of this car—originally a '79 911 SC—has gone way overboard in making it "his own." The result, although still recognizable as a Porsche, is jarring to my eye. I can't think of why I would want to own such a car. Admittedly the impact bumper 911 he started with was not the most attractive Porsche, but this was a design element forced on the company by government regulation not by the design department. Although a so-called perfect personalized Porsche that works for the owner, the so-called "rolling sculpture" creation featured does not get more than a passing shrug by me.

The January *Panorama* was the yearly design issue. In it the long-term thought and deliberation that have gone into the design of Porsche sports cars from the beginning were highlighted. I have always been impressed by the continuity of the company's designs; any car geek can instantly recognize a Porsche car regardless of model year, yearly upgrades and specials notwithstanding. The 911 GT3, Carrera GT, Boxster Spyder, and 356 Coupe featured in this issue are gorgeous, and any attempt to tinker with their body style will inevitably be a disastrous downgrade. These cars are top-of-the line models, but the same could be said for lesser Porsches. Race cars are an exception. They are modified to win races not concours, and bodywork modifications are made in the interest of performance, with looks secondary.

One last point. The modified Porsches created by Singer, Ruff, and certain other shops strike me as more tastefully done than those from the average back-street mechanic. The people in these shops have a good sense of design and choose their modifications with that sensibility in mind rather than just because they look snazzy. Slight modifications that do not alter the basic look of the car also are okay, if attractively done. Engine upgrades are fine, too. A modified car should strike you as tasteful, appealing, and well thought-out rather than as a piecemeal contraption. But, to each her/his own.

If you disagree with my opinion that is your prerogative. There are lots of hot rod shows where you can get your fill, maybe even of some Porsches.
