

# How Motor-Stadt Region Was Born 50 Years Ago in 1973 – Part 2

The Motor-Stadt board and officers would like to extend our sincere thanks to Mark for his contributions made here in the club newsletter, and especially for his 50 years of club dedication and his part in forming the Motor-Stadt Region Porsche club into what it has become today for members old-and-new to enjoy for years to come. With our gratitude to you, Mark, we appreciate you.

- From your Motor-Stadt board and officers

In the July 2023 Madness newsletter edition, Part 1 of the MSR history story summarized how the region was created in 1973 from an idea in the minds of two motivated Porsche enthusiasts. In this newest installment, I will describe some of the challenges the new board encountered and the success those efforts achieved.

With the new charter milestone accomplished there was still much to do. Jerry Dillinger took the leadership role as MSR president. He chose board members to provide assistance with virtually every aspect of managing a newly formed club. A newsletter needed to be created and named and future events needed to be quickly planned. Jerry hit the road running. With his drafting skills, Jerry created the now famous MSR logo which happily endures to this day. The newsletter was named *Madness* which also still remains today.

Jerry recruited members to help in various functions. Board members included: President, Jerry Dillinger; VP, Mark Haveman; Treasurer, Hazel Leonard; secretary, Larry Beardsley; and newsletter editor, Bob Berg; Assisting board members included: Mike Allen, Bill Holler, and Paul Weston.

Frequent board meetings in the beginning set the groundwork for future club activities such as autocrosses, group trips to major sports car races, a Fall color tour to Northern Michigan, a Meridian Mall sports car show, and casual events like local Porsche Park picnics. One of the best early events was in June 1973 when at least 22 Porsches gathered at Williams P-A to begin a driving trip into Canada to attend the Can Am race at Mosport Park which was the first race entry for the famous Sunoco Penske-Porsche 917-30. We toured together and even camped in tents along the high shore of Lake Ontario. Imagine attempting that feat these days.

The *Madness* newsletter was also a major hurdle. For a little lesson in newsletter creation in those early years, note there were no personal computers, no word processing software, and no inexpensive printing equipment. Each page needed to be carefully laid out on 8.5" X 14" graph paper. That means headlines and titles were meticulously created letter-by-letter with Chartpak rub-on lettering. Electric typewriters provided the regular text and stories. The process was a very labor intensive "cut & paste" job and usually meant long hours for several members in someone's office at least once per month. Cover art was usually created by one of our members.



The cost of printing and mailing the monthly newsletters was offset by advertising revenue. Reliable advertisers at the time included Williams Porsche-Audi, German Automotive (independent service), Bruce Beltmans Chequered Flag (auto parts) as well as local restaurants and tire dealers.



**Call to Order –** President Steve called the meeting to order at 6:34 PM.

**Approval of Agenda –** A motion to approve the agenda for the August 8<sup>th</sup> meeting was approved unanimously. (Moved J. Lavender / Seconded J. Yen)

**Meeting Minutes** – The July 11<sup>th</sup> board meeting minutes were previously approved via E-mail.

**Membership Report –** Steve delivered the membership report on Don's behalf. The club's current membership is 193 primaries, 88 affiliates (281 total) + 15 juniors.
